His Story

We know very little about Walter. He was born on the 16th December 1894 in Church Hulme and we know that he was living in Cranage in 1901 when he was aged 6.

10 years later – in 1911, he was working as a cowman at Cotton Hall. At the end of the war he must initially have been in hospital as this is indicated on the absent voters list for the village. He died in 1964 in the Crewe area aged 70.

His War Record

We know nothing about Walter's military career but know that he must have served as his name is recorded on the Roll of Honour in St Luke's church.

We know also from the absent voters list of 1919 that he served at some point with the Royal Garrison Artillery, (RGA).
