His Story

Eli was the son of Eli and Harriet Pickstock and was born in February 1884 in Holmes Chapel.

The census of 1891 shows the family were living at Micklehurst, Church Hulme and Eli was aged 7. His father worked as a School Attendance Officer, an Income Tax Collector and Assistant Overseer.

In 1901 the family are still in the Village, Holmes Chapel and Eli, aged 17, is a house painter. His father as well as being the School Attendance Officer is now a Builder and Contractor and the Parish Clerk.

By 1911 Eli is living at the house of Joseph Steele (his father in law), Middlewich Road, Church Hulme, aged 27, and working as a house painter.

He had been married in 1910 to Maud who was a dressmaker.

He was buried on 26th October 1944 at Church Hulme aged 60.

His War Record

There was no information recorded in the Parish Magazines but he is listed on Roll of Honour.

His military record shows that he was an Ordinary Seaman with the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve with Service Number: Mersey 5/133.

He received the British War Campaign Medals.
